1980s: The first human genome map was created, showing the location of genes on chromosomes.



1990s: The Human Genome Project was launched, a large-scale international research effort to determine the sequence of the human genome.

2000: The first complete draft of the human genome was published, showing that humans have approximately 25,000 genes.
